

VILLAGE OF LEGAL

By-Law #29-90

A By-Law of the Village of Legal in the Province of Alberta for the purpose of amending By Law #451 - Business Licensing.

WHEREAS, The Council of the Village of Legal deems it advisable to amend By Law #451 Business Licensing.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Village of Legal pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Government Act, Section 224, Chapter M-26 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1980 and amendments thereto hereby enacts as follows:

Schedule "A" - CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTORS Page 2

Building and Construction General Contractor including all sub-trades - \$350.00

- 1) That the person acting as General Contractor for personal dwelling be exempt from General Contractor's Fee of \$350.00 subject to special condition.
- 2) That the acting General Contractor be responsible for insuring that all subtrades employed by him be licensed by the Village of Legal. Failure to comply could result in loss of the Damage Deposit.

The following By Law of the Village of Legal in the Province of Alberta is now considered redundant and is hereby repealed:


By Law #18-89 (Amending By Law #451 - Business Licensing.

VILLAGE OF LEGAL TRAFFIC BY LAW

WHEREAS the Highway Traffic Act, 1980, Chapter h-7 of the 1980 Statutes of Alberta, Section 16 (1) and Section 16 (2) empowers the Village Council to pass bylaws dealing with the regulations, control and management of vehicle, animal and pedestrian traffic:

AND WHEREAS the aforesaid Section 16 (1) in part reads as follows:

"with respect to highways under its direction, control and management, the council of a municipality may make bylaws, not inconsistent with this Act and on matters for which no provision is made in this Act, for the regulation and control of vehicle, animal and pedestrian traffic."

AND WHEREAS the aforesaid Section 16 (2) reads as follows:

"the Council of a municipality may make bylaws not inconsistent with this Act, and for which no provision is made in this Act."

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Village of Legal in the Province of Alberta, hereby enacts a Bylaw to regulate vehicle, animal and pedestrian traffic in the Village of Legal.

PART 1
DEFINITIONS

- 101 This Bylaw may be cited as the Village of Legal Traffic Bylaw.
- 102 In this Bylaw except where otherwise defined
- (1) "Administrator" means the Administrator of the Village of Legal.
 - (2) "Alley" means a narrow highway providing access to the rear of buildings and parcels of land.
 - (3) "Bicycle" includes any cycle propelled by human power upon which person may ride, regardless of the number of wheels it may have.
 - (4) "Boulevard" means, in an urban area, that part of a highway that
 - (a) is not a roadway, and
 - (b) is that part of the sidewalk that is not especially adapted to the use of or ordinarily used by pedestrians.
 - (5) "Centre line" means
 - (a) the centre of a roadway measured from the curbs, or in the absences of curbs, from the edges of the roadway, or
 - (b) in the case of a divided highway, that portion of the highway separating the roadways for traffic moving in the opposite directions.
