Off-Highway Vehicle Bylaw #04-2022

11415 Resolution #11415

RESOLVED that proposed Bylaw #04-2022, being a bylaw to provide for the regulation, control, and management of off-highway vehicles within the Town of Legal, is hereby amended as follows:

- a) The entire OHV Bylaw is revised to correct minor formatting, spelling and grammatical errors.
- b) Section 3.1(d): "appointed representative" has been changed to "designate".
- c) Section 4.4: "approved helmet" has been changed to "safety helmet".
- d) Section 4.7 has been deleted and replaced with: "During times of high to extreme fire hazard, the provincial government or local authority may implement a fire restriction or fire ban whereas all use of Off-Highway Vehicles shall be banned within the limits of the Town of Legal."
- e) Section 5.1(a): "valid driver's license" has been changed to "valid operator's license".
- f) Section 5.2: the word "operators" was added before the word "license".
- g) Section 6.1(b) has been deleted and replaced with: "The CAO, upon application from an organization, association, or registered society under the Societies Act, may approve and provide written consent for the use of Off-Highway Vehicles within the boundaries of the Town for a specific period of time. Documentation relevant to the permit issued must be carried for the duration of the event for presentation to enforcement if requested."
- h) Section 6.2: "Trail system" was added as subsection (h).
- i) Section 6.3 was deleted and replaced with: "Notwithstanding Subsection 6.1(b) and Subsection 9.3, no person may operate an off-highway vehicle at a speed in excess of twenty (20) kilometers per hour on any portion of the Town of Legal where such vehicles are permitted to operate.
- j) Section 7.2: the word "municipal" was added before the words "compost site".
- k) Section 7.3 was deleted and replaced with: "No or animal shall be allowed in a trailer towed by an Off-Highway Vehicle."
- l) Section 9.2: the word "off-highway" was added before the word "vehicle".
- m) Section 10.1(b): the words "of the first offence" was added after "within one (1) year".
- n) Section 11.0 and 12.0 were deleted in their entirety and replaced with: 11.0 Municipal Violation Tag and Violation Tickets
 - 11.1 Any person who contravenes any section of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable upon conviction to a fine as set out in Schedule "A" which is attached hereto and forms part of this Bylaw.
 - 11.2 Under no circumstances shall any person contravening any provisions of this Bylaw be subject to the penalty of imprisonment.
 - 11.3 Nothing in this Bylaw shall be construed as curtailing or abridging the right of the Municipality to obtain compensation or to maintain an action for loss of or damage to property from or against the person or persons responsible.
 - 11.4 A Bylaw Enforcement Officer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue a Violation Tag to any person whom, the Bylaw Enforcement Officer has reasonable and probable grounds to believe, has contravened any provision of this Bylaw.
 - 11.5 A Violation Tag may be issued to such person:
 - a) either personally; or
 - b) by mailing a copy to such person at his or her last known post office address.
 - 11.6 The Violation Tag shall be in a form approved by the Municipality and shall state:
 - a) the name of the person;
 - b) the offence;
 - c) the appropriate penalty for the offence as specified; in Schedule "A" c this Bylaw;
 - d) that the penalty shall be paid within thirty (30) days of the issuance of the Violation Tag;

- any other information as may be required by the Municipality. e)
- 11.7 Where a contravention of this Bylaw is of a continuing nature, further Violation Tags may be issued by a Bylaw Enforcement Officer, provided that no more than one Violation Tag shall be issued for each day that the contravention continues.
- 11.8 Where a Violation Tag is issued pursuant to this Bylaw, the person to whom the Violation Tag is issued may, in lieu of being prosecuted for the offence, pay to the Municipality, the penalty specified in the Violation Tag.
- 11.9 Nothing in this Bylaw shall prevent a Bylaw Enforcement Officer from immediately issuing a Violation Ticket to any person who contravenes any provision of this Bylaw.
- 11.10 If the penalty specified in a Violation Tag is not paid within the prescribed time period, then a Bylaw Enforcement Officer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue a Violation Ticket pursuant to the Provincial Offences Procedure Act.
- Section 12.1: the words "unless otherwise repealed by Council" were added 0) to the end of the clause.
- Schedule "B": "Trail System" was added to non-Permitted areas as subsection p) (h).
